You will be working in a group to create a presentation about a famous court case from the 1920's. Each member of your group will be responsible for creating at

least 1 slide for the presentation. After the Keynote is finished, one person in your group will be responsible for presenting the Keynote to the class.

The Keynote will be at least 7 slides long. Slides you must include are:

- 1. Main People: The main 3-5 people involved in the court case
- 2. The Crime: A summary of the crime
- 3. The Court Case: A summary of the court case
- 4. Results: The results and what happened to the main people
- 5. Importance: Why the case is important and how it relates to what we've talked about the 1920s

Each slide should have no more than 3 bullet points, so you may need to make multiple slides to cover each of the 5 topics. Each slide should also have a picture. The first slide of your presentation should be: Your Topic and who is in your group. The last slide should say The End.

Each person will be graded on:

- 1. The overall Keynote
- 2. Their individual slide
- 3. The information you provide the presenter
- 4. How well you and the group use the time you are given

Your group will have 2 days only to finish the information for entire Keynote. If you think you may need more time, plan on working somewhere after school. This will be your final grade for the unit.

The court cases are:

The Lindbergh Baby Kidnapping The Black Sox Scandal Leopold and Loeb The Scopes Trial Sacco and Vanzetti

Each of the cases are listed on our website under Unit 6. The link will provide basic information about the case, more research will be needed.
